Post Education and Mentoring Programs

Did you know that your ongoing support to Spring Meeting, Golf Tournaments, and other events sustains the Boston Post's mission to support students interested in engineering and science as early as fifth grade? Our Education and Mentoring Programs will be funding the following programs over the next 12 months:

1. Summer Programs in Robotics or other engineering/science related programs for up to four middle school students - \$2,000
2. Mathcounts - a math enrichment, coaching & competition program that promotes middle school mathematics achievement - Four Eastern Massachusetts Regional competitions - \$2,000
3. Schools to Careers Bioengineering Symposium – The Symposium is a three day seminar where 24 students with an interest in math and science visit area businesses to learn about careers in science and engineering. This year students visited Deer Island, Shaw Environmental, Biogen IDEC, and Acambis. - \$2,000
4. SAME Summer Camps – We send up to three high school students on full scholarship to an Army, Navy, or Air Force Sponsored camp to learn engineering and construction skills - \$3,000
5. FIRST Lego League Robotics – Middle school students solve real-world engineering challenges, develop important life skills, and learn to make positive contributions to society. The Boston Post is sponsoring a Lego Robotics team in Easton, MA - \$500
6. FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC) - A unique varsity sport of the mind designed to help high-school-aged young people discover how interesting and rewarding the life of engineers and researchers can be. The Boston Post is once again sponsoring the Algonquin High School Robotics team - \$1,000

Through the years these programs have really made a positive impact on the next generation of engineers. A great example of this is Brad Davis. The Boston Post sponsored him at the USAFA Summer Camp a couple of years ago. Brad had a great experience, decided to attend another service academy (West Point), and is now majoring in Systems Engineering.

These programs are critical to the development of our future engineers and scientists and are only possible through the ongoing support of our sustaining members.
